



NOTICE OF POWER AND INTENT TO SELL TAX-DEFAULTED PROPERTY

Pursuant to Section 3361-3362 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code

Notice is hereby given that the real properties described below will, by operation of law, become subject to the Tax Collector's power to sell. This is due to the fact that five or more years will have lapsed from the date the property taxes became delinquent and unpaid and are considered tax-defaulted.

The parcels listed herein will become subject to the Tax Collector's power to sell on July 1, 2017, at 12:01 a.m., by operation of law, for non-payment of taxes. The property will be subject to sale at public auction unless a Five Year Installment Plan for eligible properties is established prior to 5:00 p.m. on June 30, 2017 or all unpaid property taxes, penalties and fees are paid in full prior to the date the property is sold at public auction.

All information concerning redemption of tax-defaulted property will be furnished, upon request, by Shari L. The amounts necessary to redeem (pay in full) the tax-defaulted properties are set forth opposite the parcel numbers as of June 30, 2017. These amounts include all defaulted property taxes, penalties and costs that have accrued since the date of default through June 30, 2017.
